

Over 200 landmarks to light up UN blue on 70th anniversary

①UNITED NATIONS (AP) — More than 200 landmarks in 60 countries from the Pyramids in Egypt to the Eiffel Tower in Paris and the Empire State Building in New York will be lit up in blue — the official color of the United Nations— on Saturday to

commemorate the 70th anniversary of the world body.

②The global celebration will <u>kick off</u> in New Zealand and then at the Sydney Opera House in Australia. It will move across countries and continents to the Great Wall of China, the <u>ancient</u> city of Petra in Jordan, Russia's Hermitage Museum, the Alhambra in Spain, the statue of Christ the Redeemer in Rio de Janeiro and many other sites.

③New Yorkers actually got a sneak preview of the celebration because U.N. headquarters was lit up in blue Friday night as well.

<u>(4)</u>U.N. Secretary-General Ban Ki-moon expressed hope that "by turning the world U.N. blue for a day, we can light a way to a better tomorrow."

⑤Oct. 24 is the anniversary of the entry into force of the U.N. Charter in 1945 and is celebrated as U.N. Day.

©The General Assembly <u>unanimously</u> approved a declaration Friday <u>reaffirming</u> the <u>faith</u> of the 193 member states in the United Nations on its 70th anniversary and the U.N.'s determination "to save succeeding generations from the <u>scourge</u> of war."

The says the <u>U.N. charter</u> unites all member states "in <u>diversity</u> beyond our differences of language, culture or religion, today as 70 years ago."

The secretary-general told the assembly that the U.N. over seven decades has brought "freedom to millions, <u>dismantling colonialism</u>, defeating <u>apartheid</u> and defending human rights for all, <u>regardless of race</u>, religion, nationality, gender or sexual <u>orientation</u>."

But he said "violence, poverty, ill-health and abuse <u>plague</u> far too many people, especially women and girls," and more people have <u>fled</u> their homes than at any time since World War II because of <u>conflict</u>, <u>oppression</u> and fear.

Nonetheless, Ban said, "without the United Nations, our world would be a far <u>bleak</u>er place." [October 23, 2015 / AP]
